hieroglyphs used for everyday writing on papyrus. It was faster to write than hieroglyphs, making it suitable for administrative documents, literary works, and religious texts.

**Demotic** An even more cursive script that evolved from Hieratic. It was the dominant script in the later periods of Ancient Egypt.
