left wing of the army the head quarters of the archduke were from the tenth to the eleventh in znaym and this generalissimo found it necessary even at the obvious risk of being out flanked on his left wing in an unfavourable situation to hazard a battle on the following day as the stoppage of the artillery train the pontoons and almost all the carriages in the defiles 1 of frainersdorf budwits
