set the stage for learning improve grade 2 students reading fluency while providing fun and purposeful reading practice for performance you ll motivate students with these easy to implement reader s theater scripts that also build students knowledge through grade level content book includes 11 original leveled scripts graphic organizers and a teacher resource cd including scripts pdfs and graphic organizers this resource is correlated to the common core state standards 104pp

this book describes the many uses and benefits of readers theatre readers theatre is a cooperative or shared reading of a poem story or lyrics of a favourite song two or more readers can take part even if a piece is scripted for only two readers and you want more than two readers to participate assign parts to a duet or chorus and there are times when you will want to give a part to a weaker and stronger reader for practice so that one reader supports the other till both feel comfortable enough to read independently simple as that

getting ready to read with readers theatre contains fifty reproducible scripts to entice the preschool and kindergarten group into beginning to read these patterned scripts based on nursery rhymes poetry and other fun things to read are grouped into traditional preschool and kindergarten curricular groupings reading level based on the flesch kincaid scale will be 0 0 kids will learn to read by hearing and repeating and seeing the patterns the authors will include information about props staging and how to introduce the concept of reading together to these very young children

readers theater is a powerful tool for developing reading fluency the scripts are designed for a range of reading levels students have opportunities to read individually in pairs and as a group the scripts do not require costumes props or scenery

more than 30 reproducible scripts in an easy to read large print format the scripts are written for two to nine readers includes scripts from such classics as goldilocks the three little pigs and peter rabbit

readers theater is an old genre of theater integrating oral interpretation and presentational theater the high interest of the scripts chosen for a readers theater production and the repetition of rehearsing text promotes fluency expressiveness and motivation readers theater is one method that may support comprehension by

developing students understanding of character very few readers theater studies measure comprehension i set up a study where nine fifth and sixth grade students from a summer literacy program each embodied a character i wanted to know if readers theater could help teach character comprehension i created a comprehension assessment tool called a character map where students identified a character s traits objectives passions problem evolution a direct text reference and an internal thought reference in this four week study students increased their understanding of traits problem and metamorphous of the characters they portrayed not only did readers theater help increase character comprehension it also led also to deeper comprehension of the story boise state university scholarworks
