sometimes the generally objective tone of the work is missing as when for example it defines communism as paradoxical and self defeating black and white photographs enhance the text and the index is detailed this volume is a worthy addition to the cold war reference shelf its coverage of people places and events that might be ignored in works with a more international perspective makes it a good starting point for anyone interested in an american focus recommended for high school public and academic libraries rbb copyright r american library association all rights r
