the purpose of this study was to determine the affect of additional guided reading instruction to result in increasing a student s reading lexile 100 200 points within a 6 8 week period through dedicated research within a building criteria has been established that students who read at an 800 lexile by january of the current grade level year a student s likelihood of scoring proficient or advanced on the map test increases than that of a student who is below a lexile of 800 for fourth grade data was collected by an online reading assessment scholastic reading inventory which assesses a student s reading through a series of questions a lexile is given to the student upon completing the assessment the test is given 3 4 times a year to monitor student progress through additional small group work with students who are 100 200 points below 800 the opportunity to master skills in reading vocabulary and comprehension increases the analysis results indicated that there was a significant difference in pre and post test scores after students received additional guided reading instruction students who received additional reading support gained reading scores to establish on grade level readers schools should set standards to initiate guided reading in the upper elementary grades to bring students up to grade level in reading
