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the program evaluation standards is a must have book for anyone responsible for reviewing evaluation proposals planning and conducting evaluations managing evaluation projects or judging the merit and worth of evaluations once completed for experienced practitioners it provides a set of values and principles by which to guide successful practice that is a set of criteria that determines whether educational evaluations are trustworthy and fair the standards sets expectations of the design and implementation of educational evaluation for all practitioners in all types of educational arenas even those involved in social programming endeavors for newcomers and those less experienced who may be responsible for commissioning and using evaluations the standards supplies a useful framework of generating a list of questions to raise about any evaluation plan or final report in an effort to assess its pros and cons the book is an invaluable how to resource for graduate students venturing out into the field and it instills a sense of what it means to be a responsible evaluator for clients or consumers the book offers advice on what they should expect of an evaluation publisher description

first published in 1994 this text is designed to be used by graduate level social work students in courses on evaluation and program design over the course of 20 years and 6 editions the goals of the book have remained the same to prepare students to participate in evaluative activities within their organizations to prepare students to become critical producers and consumers of professional evaluative literature and to prepare students for more advanced evaluation courses and texts grinnell gabor and unrau aim to meet these objectives by presenting a unique approach that is realistic practical applied and user friendly while a majority of textbooks focus on program level evaluation some recent books present case level evaluation methods but rely on inferentially powerful but difficult to implement experimental baseline designs this text assumes that neither of these approaches adequately reflects the realities of the field or the needs of students and beginning practitioners instead program evaluation for social workers offers a blend of the two that demonstrates how they can complement one another the integration of case level and program level approaches provides an accessible adaptable and realistic framework for students to more easily grasp and implement in the real world

this book looks back at the origins of program evaluation by summarizing comparing and contrasting the work of seven major theorists of program evaluation it provides an important perspective on the current state of evaluation theory and provides suggestions for improving its practice

evaluation is a systematic method for collecting analyzing and using data to examine the effectiveness and efficiency of programs and as importantly to contribute to continuous program improvement see appendix a for key definitions cdc has a deep and long standing commitment to the use of data for decision making as well as the responsibility to describe the outcomes achieved with its public health dollars when programs conduct strong practical evaluations on a routine basis the findings can both meet accountability mandates as well as improve program effectiveness in an effort to bring greater consistency to the use of evaluation for these purposes evaluation experts around the agency developed a set of recommendations to inform evaluation planning and implementation the goal is to increase the use of evaluation data for continuous program improvement agency wide these are recommendations and not mandates because our programs vary so much in purpose funding and history it is expected that the leadership of centers divisions and large programs will seriously and systematically consider which of these guidelines and recommendations are most important to improve evaluation capacity and the quality of program evaluations in their own organizations why are these guidelines and recommendations needed although program evaluation has always been a respected component of public health practice the ability to conduct meaningful program evaluations has been constrained by wide differences in expertise resources of programs and commitment to evaluation unfortunately as the accountability environment has intensified at all levels of government public health programs often find themselves unable to make a persuasive case for the efficacy and effectiveness of their programs likewise in an environment of scarce resources we need more and better information about which interventions and approaches of the many options open to us are best suited to the problem strong program evaluation can help us identify our best investments as well as determine how to establish and sustain them as optimal practice while the emphasis is on cdc practice most of these recommendations when implemented will improve the ways in which partners grantees and community based organizations evaluate and improve their program efforts as well

evaluation and politics are related in a number of ways while programme evaluators have traditionally tried to be neutral objective and scientific in their assessment of programmes the results of evaluation are inherently political and are used by politicians programme administrators special interest groups and other stakeholders for political purposes the contributors argue that since evaluation cannot be divorced from its political context the political dimension must be understood in order to conduct effective evaluations
