this study examined the convergent validity of the personality assessment inventory pai with the child abuse potential inventory cap in order to further the research investigating applications of the pai in child access evaluations it was hypothesized that there would be two groups of pai scales assumed to exist that highly correlate with the cap abuse scale score these two groups include the psychopathological cluster and the stressed cluster of pai scales the examinees in this study were comprised of parents referred for psychological testing who were suspected or convicted of abusive behavior toward their children and were undergoing child access litigation the results support the assumption that the stressed and psychopathic clusters of the pai do indeed exist furthermore there were several statistically significant correlations between the pai scales and the cap contrary to the hypothesis of this study the results suggest the stressed cluster of pai scales were better predictors of the cap than the psychopathic cluster however certain individual scales namely vpi str and agg were found to be the best overall predictors of the cap therefore this study shows strong support for further investigation of individual pai scales and less support for using clusters of pai scales to predict the cap
