the law of special education and non public schools provides an informed explanation of section 504 the idea their regulations and the cases that they have generated even though the authors offer educators information on the rights of children in non public schools this book is not a how to manual it is designed to help make educators and parents aware of the requirements governing the laws that impact the rights of children with disabilities in order to implement both section 504 and the idea in light of the detail that the book provides it serves as a current and concise desk reference for educators ranging from building or district level administrators to classroom teachers to resource specialists in special education and related fields

this book is written as an easily accessible guide for headteachers and other general education administrators who administer and or interact with special education programmes and services in their schools the book is designed to provide basic foundational knowledge of special education that every headteacher needs in order to lead effectively as well as examples for how to create effective special education in this era of universal accountability for improving student achievement and school wide improvement planning it is imperative that headteachers understand fully the key components of special education headteachers may need basic legal and or procedural information but more important are the understandings about who gets into special education as well as current thinking about how to educate children with diverse disabilities

reform in education has focused mainly on development of new programs and procedures to increase the achievement of the student in the classroom teacher evaluations are now based on how students perform in their classrooms on yearly standardized tests the advent of integrating students with special needs into the regular classroom has brought both benefits and concerns for average and above average students special education in the united states has evolved from institutional and segregated environments to inclusion in the regular education classrooms we examine how the practice has affected all students and question whether this change has created equal opportunity for those students without special education needs this book researches and reports on issues of current practice e g teacher preparation placement of students with special needs implications for the average and above in the classroom and the financial costs driving placement decisions in the education system we examine the lowering of standards so all can pass tests report on loss of engagement of students by middle school and mourn the squandering of creativity to appease a mandate sir ken robinson relates that education is meant to take us into a future we cannot even grasp yet we continue on a road that lowers our educational ranking

internationally we recommend to provide services for all students and take the system from its current state to one that provides a free and appropriate education for all

exploring the history of disability and special education practices from the seventeenth to the twenty first century indicates similar ideas and similar human approaches that have developed independently over time people who survived the eugenics movement were placed in asylums and segregated special schools in europe and america the general systems theory has been applied as a logico mathematical discipline to include students of all special needs categories in their placements and education the systems approach to special education practices has evolved from a historical model of diagnoses and cures to the biological and ecological models integrating technology as the driving force in implementing curriculum instruction and assessment

osgood examines the history of the school lives of children placed in formal or informal special education settings in american public schools during the last 120 years as the public school system in the united states grew throughout the 20th century special education became a recognized and dependable but marginalized arm of public schooling throughout the 1900s special education emerged as its own world in many ways developing policies practices structures and an identity that became more diverse and inclusive this work describes and interprets the nature and characteristics of special education it examines carefully the human aspects of identification and placement the nature of work and play in the classroom the relationship among students teachers administrators and parents involved in the process the status and relation of children with disabilities to their non disabled peers in various school settings and the impact of school experiences on the lives of these children beyond school
