a moving deeply researched account of survivors experiences of liberation from nazi death camps and the long difficult years that followed seventy years have passed since the tortured inmates of hitler s concentration and extermination camps were liberated when the horror of the atrocities came fully to light it was easy for others to imagine the joyful relief of freed prisoners yet for those who had survived the unimaginable the experience of liberation was a slow grueling journey back to life in this unprecedented inquiry into the days months and years following the arrival of allied forces at the nazi camps a foremost historian of the holocaust draws on archival sources and especially on eyewitness testimonies to reveal the complex challenges liberated victims faced and the daunting tasks their liberators undertook to help them reclaim their shattered lives historian dan stone focuses on the survivors their feelings of guilt exhaustion fear shame for having survived and devastating grief for lost family members their immense medical problems and their later demands to be released from displaced persons camps and resettled in countries of their own choosing stone also tracks the efforts of british american canadian and russian liberators as they contended with survivors immediate needs then grappled with longer term issues that shaped the postwar world and ushered in the first chill of the cold war years ahead

in march of 1933 a disused factory surrounded by barbed wire held 223 prisoners in the town of dachau by the end of 1945 the ss concentration camp system had become an overwhelming landscape of terror twenty two large camps and over one thousand satellite camps throughout germany and europe were at the heart of the nazi campaign of repression and intimidation the importance of the camps in terms of nazi history and our modern world cannot be questioned dr nikolaus wachsmann is the first historian to write a complete history of the camps combining the political and the personal wachsmann will examine the organisation of such an immense genocidal machine whilst drawing a vivid picture of life inside the camps for the individual prisoner the book will give a voice to those typically

nazi concentration camps kzs were established in the vicinity of local communities across europe arguably the individuals in these communities were not perpetrators nor were they victims like those imprisoned in the camps yet they did not simply stand by on the sidelines passive uninvolved or untouched by the presence of the camps local citizenries engaged in ambiguous and highly interactive relations with their local camps willingly and unwillingly working for the perpetrators but also aiding inmates after the war nazi camps were often repurposed initially as post war internment camps and subsequently as penal institutions military compounds or housing encampments over time many were transformed into sites of memory to commemorate nazi persecution governments and groups of survivors have often determined the re use and commemoration of kzs but these processes take place on local territory and have direct implications for nearby communities therefore locals have continued to interact with camp legacies nazi camps and their neighbouring communities examines how local populations evolved to live with the nazi camps both before and after the war helen j whatmore thomson evaluates the different sorts of locality camp relationships that developed in wartime france germany and the netherlands and how these played out in post war scenarios of re use and memorialization using three case studies of major camps in western europe natzweiler struthof neuengamme and vught the book traces the contested developments of these camp sites in the changing political climates of the post war years and explores the interrelated dynamics and trajectories of local and national memory

during the second world war american soldiers participated in the discovery and liberation of many nazi concentration camps this monograph deals with their

experience in the concentration camps what they saw and what they did and the long term affects of their experience the author has drawn heavily on the oral histories and personal papers of approximately 500 world war ii veterans and on military documents from the national archives in washington dc and the united states army military history institute in harrisburg pa though substantial information was available at high levels in the american government and to a lesser extent in the national newspapers little was done to inform the gis about the existence or purpose of the concentration camps american soldiers were not prepared emotionally or psychologically for the enormous human suffering and degradation they witnessed viewing the camp atrocities and being exposed to the full extent of nazi barbarism was a watershed experience for many american soldiers many developed an all consuming hatred for germans particularly the ss which occasionally culminated in a take no more prisoners approach to warfare conversely american gis responded to the malnourished and filthy survivors with great compassion they were horrified by the condition of the survivors but with few exceptions did not ignore or reject them they assisted the survivors in every way possible often grief stricken that they could not do more liberators faced homecoming difficulties and adjustments common to veterans however they were often isolated and marginalized by civilians who refused to acknowledge the camps some veterans suffered for years with severe trauma symptoms similar to ptsd criteria related to the atrocities witnessed in the camps many veterans acknowledge that camp liberation had a long term impact upon their life many attribute their involvement in politics charitable organizations and community affairs to lessons learned in the camps lessons about justice equality and generosity further almost all liberators support public holocaust education and many participate themselves by giving witness testimony to school classes and community and religious organizations jewish american liberators experience was different after seeing the camps many developed a heightened sense of their jewish identify and a deeper commitment to israel the eyewitness testimony of the liberators confirms that already provided by survivors and contributes an additional perspective on the nazi concentration camp system

this is the first historical survey of the gulag based on newly accessible archival sources as well as memoirs and other studies published since the beginning of glasnost over the course of several decades the soviet labor camp system drew into its orbit tens of millions of people political prisoners and their families common criminals prisoners of war internal exiles local officials and prison camp personnel this study sheds new light on the operation of the camp system both internally and as an integral part of a totalitarian regime that institutionalized violence as a
