this book explores the relationship between democracy and the economy in contemporary political thought and policy making using the concepts of economic industrial and enterprise democracy the author focuses on the history of finland and sweden during the latter part of the twentieth century the three concepts are discussed in relation to various political groups such as social democrats conservatives and liberals and the reforms that they were associated with painting a picture of changing economic thought in the nordic countries and the west more generally arguing that the concept of democracy has evolved from representative parliamentary democracy towards participation in civil society this book demonstrates how the ideal of individual freedom and choice has surpassed collective decision making these shared characteristics between finland sweden and other western countries challenge the view that the nordic countries have been exceptional in resisting neoliberalism in fact as this book shows neoliberalism has been influential to the nordics since the 1970s offering an innovative and conceptual perspective on european political history this book will appeal to scholars interested in nordic political history and modern european history more generally

at the start of the twentieth century political parties had the potential to focus grass roots interest in the development of modern democratic nation states yet all the new parties were met with suspicion across europe particularly among liberals these popular misgivings and the way the liberals nevertheless managed to build a party are the subject of this book in this book historian martin Åberg argues that because of liberalism's individualistic traits which left liberals less susceptible to political organisation on a mass basis party members had to come to an uneasy compromise between individual and collective action Åberg compares two regions värmland in sweden and schleswig holstein in germany which historically both had a significant liberal presence despite its organisational shortcomings liberalism in sweden paved the way for the peaceful democratisation of the state in germany however liberalism turned conservative foreshadowing the extreme nationalism and nazism that was to come Åberg argues that the peculiarities of organisational

behaviour go some way to explain the very different outcomes

marion reiser everhard holtmann local independent lists as political actors are a common phenomenon on the local level in many european countries in established western democracies as well as in the new democracies in central and eastern europe in some west european countries these non partisan groups have been an established and stable element in the local political system for decades ty cally they understand themselves as protectors of a harmonious factual political style in their opinion good local politics is not compatible with party politics so they consequently perceive themselves as non parties during the last two d ades presence and success of local lists have steadily increased in these co tries furthermore during the last years local lists emerged also in countries which had been formerly fully party politicised on the local level explanations offered for these developments are often based on the observation of a general decline of trust in established parties and politicians hence it has been argued that the disenchantment with political parties is a fertile ground for local lists for the central and east european countries this argument can be ployed only to a certain extent local lists established themselves in the early 1990 s as important actors on the local level especially due to a lack of party organisation in the process of democratic consolidation

there is strong social and political interest in active citizenship and values in education internationally active citizenship requires children to experience and internalize moral values for human rights developing their own opinions and moral responsibility while investment in young children is recognised as an important factor in the development of citizenship for a cohesive society less is known about how early years teachers can encourage this in the classroom this book will present new directions on how teachers can promote children s learning of moral values for citizenship in classrooms the research provided offers important insights into teaching for active citizenship by providing an analysis of educational contexts for moral values for active citizenship highlighting teachers beliefs about knowing and knowledge

personal epistemologies and how these relate to children's learning and understanding about social and moral values discussing the impact of teachers' beliefs on teaching practices evidence suggests that investment in the early years is vital for all learning and specifically for developing an understanding of active citizenship for tolerant and cohesive societies this book will be essential reading for the professional education of early years teachers interested in teaching for active citizenship

although this book is likely to attract a specialist readership since it deals with local and regional levels of government in four nordic countries it also contributes to a general analysis of sub national and international identities the authors provide clear conceptual frameworks for discussing the challenges to protecting and developing autonomy at sub national level issues relating to decentralisation of decision making within the context of the european union are well presented aslib book guide the strength of this book lies in its treatment of the relationship between regionalisation concepts and internationalisation or europeanisation to be more accurate the authors are excellent in their coverage of how local and regional governments have adapted their procedures to take account of the impact of such trends as european integration and the usage of putnam multi level governance is particularly useful the book is a significant contribution and first class lee miles university of hull uk the european political landscape is one of constant flux and it is this alternating integration and disintegration which influences the basic conditions in which political power is exercised this book argues that the interests of the cities and regions of europe are increasingly influenced by european supranational institutions rather than the nation state and that governance in europe is shifting to a regional and local level

this edited collection explores varying shapes of nationalism in different regional and historical settings in order to analyse the important role that nationalism has played in shaping the contemporary world taking a global approach the collection includes case studies from the middle east africa asia and north america unique not only in its wide range of geographically

diverse case studies this book is also innovative due to its comparative approach that combines different perspectives on how nations have been understood and how they came into being highlighting the transnational connections between various countries the authors examine what is meant by the concepts of nation and national identity discussing themes such as citizenship ethnicity historical symbols and the role of elites by exploring these entangled categories of nationalism the authors argue that throughout history elites have created artificial versions of nationalism through symbolism and mythology which has led to nationalism being understood through social constructivist or primordialist lenses this diverse collection will appeal to researchers studying nationalism including historians political scientists and anthropologists
