contemporary case studies on leadership issues in higher education and k 12 education each of the 32 case studies include critical thinking questions that encourage students to apply leadership theory and concepts to real life situations engaging practical and relevant leadership case studies in education is the perfect companion for educational leadership courses

parents lawmakers supervisors and unions are among the many constituencies that demand influence if not control of the educational process how does the school administrator balance all the needs of the various groups and still remain true to the ultimate though most powerless constituency the students through case studies and anecdotes based on real life experiences the authors share the ups and downs of the educational world seeking to find the balance that is most effective in ensuring success school leadership case studies solving school problems details decision making and actions taken that dramatically affect the success of students and schools as well as school systems this second edition continues and improves on the first edition with a series of new and timely school leadership case studies that require the reader to reflect on the variety of issues that cross the principal s desk every day the reader will find the case studies and anecdotes highly absorbing they are so real fraught with complexity and will require the reader to use a sophisticated decision making process

this book serves as an instructional tool for development of skills related to the organizational leadership of adults the text offers teaching cases that explicitly partner the leadership and adult development literature bases so readers can work to apply leadership for adult development to real world scenarios case studies in leadership and adult development applying theoretical perspectives to real world challenges consists of 19 chapters organized into three parts part i includes four chapters drawn from business and industry leaders experiences encompassing cases from nonprofit for profit and non governmental agencies part ii delves into three chapters that focus on the challenges of leading through crisis including how the coronavirus pandemic shapes decision making and impacts leadership in both k 12 and higher education environments part iii offers a comprehensive view of education through 12 chapters four of which are drawn from higher education settings part iii s balance includes cases from

elementary middle and secondary schools and district level leadership written for graduate level courses in adult education each case focuses on at least one major theory from both the leadership and adult development domains including questions for discussion and reflection the book allows students to explore the linkages between leadership theories and adult development theories within the context of real world scenarios

discusses the use of qualitative research methods in leadership studies beginning with an examination of the paradigmatic assumptions underlying qualitative research this book presents various qualitative methods that can be placed on a continuum ranging from purely qualitative to highly quantitative

effective leadership does not occur by chance leaders must be trained and groomed for the daunting responsibility of leading organizations research shows that half of the people currently in leadership positions will fail why they fail and what can be done to prevent failure are the main subjects of this book it shows that effective leadership is possible and illustrates why and how based on research and case studies from an epidemiological perspective the epidemiological word determinant is used frequently and is a word that no other book on leadership uses epidemiologists work from two basic principles namely that all diseases have determinants and that diseases do not occur randomly in other words there are always causes for diseases and patterns that describe how diseases spread effective and ineffective leadership always have determinants that are not randomly distributed the impacts are uniformly and deeply spread throughout an organization like the epidemiologists this book not only identifies leadership determinants but also provides research based antidotes at the end of each chapter along with a summary of the most salient points in the chapter this book offers examples of leadership and governance from the non profit sector businesses public and private education higher education and other organizations highlighting over 50 case studies to illustrate concepts about leadership

the impact of teacher leaders case studies from the field is designed to celebrate spotlight teach inspire and encourage first and foremost the authors wish to celebrate the accomplishments and dedication of teacher leaders research clearly shows that teachers have the greatest impact on student achievement it is also evident that teacher leaders are the bridge between their colleagues in the classrooms and administrators and parents initiatives can be driven impaired or abandoned based on the

support and involvement from teacher leaders teacher leadership is critical in all schools for this reason the authors spotlighted cases from coast to coast in the united states along with some international examples in an era when teacher preparation programs have decreased in numbers statistics are showing that those who successfully complete those programs are not remaining in the field and veteran teachers are leaving in record numbers it is important to spotlight the success of teachers through their leadership roles in very different school contexts case studies are an important tool in qualitative research as they provide examples of implementation examples of relationships between theory and practice allow close examination of people and contextual situations allow data collection and analysis and allows for further study of people groups events reasons and questions case studies utilize a variety of sources and use different methods for the purposes of this companion publication purposeful selection spotlighted 24 case studies where the authors interviewed teachers to collect and write narratives about their teacher leadership roles often focusing on a specific leadership experience all participating teachers were under a teacher contract at the time of the teacher leadership case study experience and were leading at the building or district level

this book examines the well covered subject of leadership from a unique perspective history s vast catalogue of leadership successes and failures through a collection of highly compelling case studies spanning two millennia it looks beyond the classic leadership parable of men in military or political crises and shows that successful leadership cannot be reduced to simplistic formulae written by experts in the field and based on rigorous research each case provides a rich and compelling account that is accessible to a wide audience from students to managers rather than serving as a vehicle for advancing a particular theory of leadership each case invites readers to reflect debate and extract their own insights
