within the limits of this study certain tendencies with respect to preference and performance can be noted individuals tend to select as a preference a problem out of a group of problems that they know or think will be more successful in solving the expectation of greater success leads individuals to prefer one problem over others and belief in success causes preference rather than preference being a cause of successful performance problems dealing with actual childhood activities seem to be highly preferred by all pupils of the junior high school grades interest in problem solving is enhanced by children working problems that are not too difficult and represent genuine childhood situations the relation between reported preference and performance is significant enough to demand attention when selecting problems for textbooks
