you're looking through a book about freeing oneself from societal and cultural constraints the house on the lagoon also grapples with bigger issues of life death poverty and racism mythological in its breadth and scope this is a masterwork from an extraordinary storyteller

in this work gonzález dismantles the myth of a dominant spanish and racially white national culture in puerto rican history he claims that the national identity is primarily mestizo mixed race with a significant contribution from africa gonzález calls the african slaves and mestizo peasantry the first puerto ricans because they were the first inhabitants who had to make the island their home having witnessed successful uprisings in neighboring haiti the spanish authorities encouraged white immigrants to settle in puerto rico in an attempt to whiten the population then thought to be tilting dangerously to the advantage of the afro antilleans these immigrants became the small but influential class of landowners and later urban professionals according to the author's grand metaphor afro antilleans and mestizos constitute the first storey or tier of the puerto rican house of the title landowners the second urban professionals the third and the managerial class the fourth

these essays deal with continuity and change in puerto rico and constitute a delightful san juan reader from a thoughtful historian's point of view

in her exciting new book marisol lebrón traces the rise of punitive governance in puerto rico over the course of the twentieth century and up to the present punitive governance emerged as a way for the puerto rican state to manage the deep and ongoing crises stemming from the archipelago's incorporation into the united states as a colonial territory a structuring component of everyday life for many puerto ricans police power has reinforced social inequality and worsened conditions of vulnerability in marginalized communities this book provides powerful examples of how puerto ricans negotiate and resist their subjection to increased levels of segregation criminalization discrimination and harm policing life and death shows how puerto ricans are actively rejecting punitive solutions and working toward alternative understandings of safety and a more just future

emotional bridges to puerto rico examines the experiences of incorporation among two groups of middle class puerto ricans one that currently lives in the u s mainland and one that has resettled in puerto rico the analysis focuses on their subjective interpretations of incorporation and the conditions under which they decide to move back and forth between the mainland and island findings reveal that migration to the mainland results in educational occupational and economic gains

in the u s which also help return migrants re enter island labor markets u s settlement brings its own set of struggles puerto ricans see themselves as members of transnational families yet the struggles of leading dual lives result in settlement decisions that reflect desires to live locally with roots in one place instead of feeling split between the two experiences with u s racism complicate these decisions given puerto ricans struggles with racial identity and exclusion in spite of their economic occupational and residential integration into mainland society this study illustrates the conditions under which various patterns of attachments to place or emotional anchoring develop and how these feelings impact future puerto rican settlement

based on a true story of one mans journey living over 14 years in puerto rico details his life his loves his struggles with the puerto rican government and the puerto rican police as the society of the island falls into an abyss he copes with living in an island that is called in the caribbean the island of enchantment but in the end becomes the island of sudden fear as his love for the island and its people turns into his lost dream

the spanish speaking island of puerto rico also known as borinquen has had a complex linguistic landscape since 1898 due to the united states colonial imposition of english as the language of administration and education even after 1948 when puerto rico was finally permitted to hold its own gubernatorial elections and determine its own language policies controversy regarding how best to achieve bilingualism continued despite many studies of the language dynamic of the island the voices of the people who actually live there have been muted this volume opens with a basic introduction to bilingualism with special reference to puerto rico it then showcases twenty five engaging personal histories written by puerto rican language professionals which reveal how they became bilingual the obstacles faced the benefits accrued and the linguistic and cultural future they envision for themselves and their children the closing chapter analyzes the commonalities of their richly detailed stories as well as the variability of their bilingual life experiences in order to inform a more nuanced language policy for puerto rico the linguistic autobiographies will resonate with bilinguals of all kinds in puerto rico and the caribbean as well as those in other countries the main message that emerges from the book is that there are many routes to multilingualism and one size fits all language policies are doomed to miss their mark
