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cinema was the most important new artistic medium of the twentieth century and modernism was the most important new aesthetic movement across the arts in the twentieth century however what exactly is the relationship between cinema and modernism cinematic modernism and contemporary film explores how in the early twentieth century cinema came to be seen as one of the new technologies which epitomised modernity and how cinema itself reflected ideas hopes and fears concerning modern life howard finn examines the emergence of a new international style of cinema combining a poetic aesthetic of the image with genre based fictional narrative and documentary realism he provides concise accounts of how theorists such as andr® bazin siegfried kracauer gilles deleuze and jacques ranci re have discussed this cinematic aesthetic clarifying debates over terms such as realism classical and avant garde as well as recent controversies over terms such as slow cinema and vernacular modernism he further argues the influence of modernism through close readings of many contemporary films including films by abbas kiarostami b®la tarr jia zhangke and angela schanelec drawing on a broad range of examples including soviet montage italian neorealism postwar new waves and the new cinema of taiwan and iran this book explores the cultural significance of modernism and its lasting influence over cinema

michael mann born 1943 is one of the most interesting directors of our time whose work lies at the intersection of the mainstream cinema and the avant garde of public entertainment and private obsession throughout his career mann has moved freely between television and cinema he produced miami vice and crime story two of the most successful tv series of the 1980 s in addition to directing the historical epic the last of the mohican s 1992 the biopic ali 2001 and more recently the crime thriller collateral 2004 and the gangster drama public enemies 2009 although varied in genre mann s films often share the same preoccupations and style the depiction of solitary men in conflict with the society in which they live

lighting and shadows are used within a range of art forms to create aesthetic effects piotr sadowski s study of light and shadow in weimar cinema and contemporaneous visual arts is underpinned by the evolutionary semiotic theories of indexicality and iconicity these theories explain the unique communicative and emotive power of light and shadow when used

in contemporary indexical media including the shadow theatre silhouette portraits camera obscura photography and film in particular sadowski highlights the aesthetic and emotional significance of shadows the cast shadow as an indexical sign maintains a physical connection with its near present referent such as a hidden person stimulating a viewer s imagination and provoking responses including anxiety or curiosity the cinematic shadow plays a stylistic role by enhancing image texture depth of field and tonal contrast of cinematic moments such enhancements are especially important in monochromatic films and sadowski interweaves the book with accounts of seminal weimar cinema moments sadowski s book is distinctive for combining historical materials and theoretical approaches to develop a deeper understanding of weimar cinema and other contemporary art forms the semiotics of light and shadows is an ideal resource for both scholars and students working in linguistics semiotics film media and visual arts

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martin scorsese us born 1942 is among the most prolific of american directors having made more than 25 features in a 40 year career that has seen him garner all the highest honours the film world can bestow he is admired and respected throughout the world for the tireless work of his film foundation in preserving america's film heritage

beginning with the proposition that there exist uniquely cinematic elements of meaning and structure stefan sharff clearly and systematically lays the foundation for literacy in cinema a sensitivity to the aesthetic elements intrinsic only to film sharff presents the basic elements of structure modes of expression and rules which he argues create a specific language and syntax of cinema

stanley kubrick usa 1928 99 was a master who took the art of filmmaking further than any other contemporary director a creative perfectionist whose work now fascinates new generations he started out as a photographer before moving into film noir aged barely 25 after which the power and originality of his work soon brought him box office success in the 1960s he lived and worked in london away from the scandal caused by his adaptation of lolita 1962 and from the major studios from which uniquely he was able to wrest total control of his films he made only a dozen features in 50 years each of which displays an extraordinary degree of technical and aesthetic invention from the sci fi 2001 a space odyssey 1968 onwards each of his masterpieces explores new genres and controversial topics such as vietnam full metal jacket 1987 violence a clockwork orange 1971 horror the shining 1980 and sexuality eyes wide shut 1999

francis ford coppola usa b 1939 is the oldest of the generation of movie brats including scorsese and spielberg who breathed new life into the hollywood of the 1970s he revived the glory of the studio age with the legendary godfather saga 1972 90 explored the soul of america at war in vietnam with apocalypse now 1979 and has directed some of the greatest actors including brando pacino and de niro having outgrown the role of director decreed by the major studios he is now an independent producer and continues to direct films with undimmed brilliance tetro 2009

it took michael mann b 1943 today a major figure in contemporary american cinema many years to establish himself his experience as a flamboyant television producer in the 1980s notably on the series miami vice overshadowed his early work as a filmmaker in 1991 mann exploded into the mainstream with the success of the last of the mohicans since then his work has focused on the crime movie with heat in 1995 collateral in 2004 and public enemies in 2009

george lucas born 1944 is a producer screenwriter and director who played a major role in the anti establishment new

hollywood movement of the 1970s and helped define the blockbuster era of the 1980s he is best known as the creator of the star warsspace opera and the producer of the iconic indiana jonesadventure film series lucas had directed thx 1138 1971 and american graffiti 1973 before launching in 1977 the first film in the star warsfranchise rapidly a worldwide pop culture phenomenon this was followed by two sequels the empire strikes back 1980 and return of the jedi 1983 sixteen years later a new trilogy the phantom menace 1999 attack of the clones 2002 and revenge of the sith 2005 were released the star warsseries has spawned a range of other media including tv series video games and comic books with this simple yet powerful saga lucas has created a brand a business empire and a technological revolution

pedro almod var spain b 1951 single handedlyrepresents the revival of spanish cinema as partof the cultural flowering of the movida madrile¶ain the 1980s new york was first to hail the unbridledimagination of this provocative director whose films are filled with transsexuals neurotics women on the verge of a nervous breakdown 1988 and even d

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
