compelling form architecture as visual persuasion is an assessment of the visual persuasiveness of buildings it demonstrates that architecture is as capable of social influence as speeches or advertisements are and that an awareness of this influence provides an insight into buildingsâ tm cultural roles the book considers a diverse array of structures ranging from museums to performance halls to universities to cathedrals to governmental buildings to palaces and to skyscrapers compelling form is an important extension of theories of persuasion and visual communication to architecture and engineering the book bases its assessments on the elements of visual literacy and then on the elements of architectural design to demonstrate that buildings monuments and even such means of commerce as bridges affect the viewer in such a way as to have social impact

graphic arts have not been rigidly separated but interrelated the one informing the other and establishing patterns of creation and reception in the classical tradition the education of the architect and artist has always stressed this relationship between the arts although modern scholarship has too often treated them as separate disciplines these volumes explore the history of this exchange between the arts as it emerged from classical theory into artistic and architectural practice issues of visual representation perspective allegory site specificity ornamentation popular culture memorials urban and utopian planning and the role of treatises manifestos and other theoretical writings are addressed as well as the critical reaction to these products and practices this title represents a variety of methods approaches and diatectical interpretations cases where architecture informs the themes and physical space of pictures or pictorial concerns inform the design and construction of the built environment the exchanges between architecture and pictures explored by these authors are found to be in all cases ideologically potent and therefore significantly expressive of their respective social political and intellectual histories

bombay art deco architecture presents a treasury of art deco buildings comprising residential commercial and civic architecture these monuments were created during the mid 30s and 40s a glamorous and optimistic era that predated the official end of the british raj the architects a small list of first generation indian architects and builders were mostly educated in english schools and trained in western architectural traditionst impatient with the british reluctance to shed the gothic and indo saracenic architectural styles that had dominated imperial bombay s urban landscape these visionaries were determined to imbue the city with a new modern style that style shares its provenance with the art deco architecture of miami beach termed tropical deco by author laura cerwinske in her seminal 1981 book built in the same era the art deco architecture of the two cities exhibits similar scale

geometry tropical vocabulary and love of romance
