this book introduces the student to the field of teaching discusses theory and practice of art education and synthesizes and prepares students to make the transition from student to art teacher it presents art education as an integration of philosophy history theory and practice bates illustrates how to apply theory to practice as an art educator models methods and experiences are provided to enlighten inspire and amuse becoming an art teacher is a refreshing approach to art methods

zealand spain and the usa including the nyc 2nd ave subway the detroit s heidelberg project the favel painting foundation and bicycle rack sculpture szekely inspires readers to look beyond the classroom walls to develop meaningful art experiences for students she shows the myriad art forms media expressions and design professions that have the influence and potential to shape the local environment reaching far beyond the traditional museum and gallery venue underpinned by a clear philosophical foundation the field tested approaches show readers how to go beyond the study of reproductions or dwelling on of the masters who are framed in art museums instead having meaningful art experiences using everyday objects and diverse collective experiences she also shows that innovative and exciting art lessons don t need large amounts of funding transportation or even a museum within the local community each chapter includes photographs talking points and key lesson ideas along with links to further resources

being your own advocate invites pre service practicing and veteran teachers to live within those tenuous and exiting first years of teaching the personal stories of six novice art teachers highlight the need for and inevitability of advocacy in the early years years 1 3 of their careers this work is based on a longitudinal study that asked participants to create a weekly video diary reflecting on their teaching experiences while the study aimed to identify common issues for new art teachers and explore new ways for them to reflect on their experiences the result was a beautiful narrative about the role of advocacy and the empowerment of new art teachers the first part of the book introduces the context and purpose of the study laying the groundwork for important stories to surface part two explores the individual stories of six novice art teachers and includes imagery and reflections from over the course of two years in the field part three brings synthesis to the stories by addressing the need to encourage and develop advocacy in early professionals common issues are identified for novice art teachers as well as implications for understanding the inner workings of novice art teacher stories and how they can inform teacher education programs and professional and personal growth for new teachers of all disciplines the final chapter offers practical resources and activities to guide future and current educators in their own journeys of empowerment

it also was found that beginning art teachers teach the skills they feel best prepared to teach and that studio production is the preferred mode of art instruction the teachers in this study were more often influenced by the teacher supervising their internship during their teacher training than by their professors or other education courses and the classroom observations and internship were perceived as the most valuable component of their training the participants also described problems they encountered in teaching which they were not prepared for of which the most frequently cited were lack of respect and support for the arts in k 12 schools and lack of sufficient funding

this handbook provides teachers with a framework for implementing inquiry based substantive art integration across the curriculum along with the background knowledge of models needed to do this drawing on ideas from harvard project zero the authors make a clear and compelling argument for how contemporary art supports student learning the text features subject specific chapters co written by teaching scholars from that discipline each chapter includes examples of contemporary art with explanations of how these works explore the fundamental concepts of the academic discipline the book concludes with a chapter on an integrated inquiry based curriculum inspired by contemporary art including guidelines for developing art projects teachers can adapt to their students interests and needs this resource is appropriate for art teachers as well as subject area teachers who are not famililar with using contemporary art in the classroom

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
