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this major new reference work with contributions from an international team of scholars provides a comprehensive account of ideas and practices of nationhood and nationalism from antiquity to the present it considers both continuities and discontinuities engaging critically and analytically with the scholarly literature in the field in volume ii leading scholars in their fields explore the dynamics of nationhood and nationalism s interactions with a wide variety of cultural practices and social institutions in addition to the phenomenon s crucial political dimensions the relationships between imperialism and nationhood nationalism and between major world religions and ethno national identities are among the key themes explained and explored the wide range of case studies from around the world brings a truly global comparative perspective to a field whose study was long constrained by eurocentric assumptions

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the years 1830 1914 witnessed a revolution in the manufacture and use of books as great as that in the fifteenth century using new technology in printing paper making and binding publishers worked with authors and illustrators to meet ever growing and more varied demands from a population seeking books at all price levels the essays by leading book historians in this volume show how books became cheap how publishers used the magazine and newspaper markets to extend their influence and how book ownership became universal for the first time the fullest account ever published of the nineteenth century revolution in printing publishing and bookselling this volume brings the cambridge history of the book in britain up to a point when the world of books took on a recognisably modern form

the cambridge history of the english novel chronicles an ever changing and developing body of fiction across three centuries an interwoven narrative of the novel s progress unfolds in more than fifty chapters charting continuities and innovations of structure tracing lines of influence in terms of themes and techniques and showing how greater and lesser authors shape the genre pushing beyond the usual period centered boundaries the history s emphasis on form reveals the range and depth the novel has achieved in english this book will be indispensable for research libraries and scholars but is accessibly written for students authoritative bold and clear the history raises multiple useful questions for future visions of the invention and re invention of the novel

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both detailed explorations of the epistemological metaphysical and ethical themes that continue to stand at the forefront of philosophy and to voice a critical attitude to the historiography behind this emphasis in philosophical thought at the same time there is due sensitivity to historical context with particular emphasis on the connections between philosophy science and theology this judiciously balanced systematic and comprehensive account of the whole of western philosophy in the period will be an invaluable resource for philosophers intellectual historians theologians political theorists historians of science and literary scholars

this short note will look at the history of greek atheos and words ultimately derived from it or in some cases modelled on it in greek latin english and a selection of other modern vernacular languages of western europe 1 it will concentrate primarily on when each of these words first appeared in each language with a brief consideration of their meaning as writers far more expert on the history of atheism show in many places in this volume investigating the history of atheistic beliefs throughout most of history is plagued by the difficulty that dire and generally fatal penalties could be incurred for the avowal of such beliefs most of the evidence for words meaning atheism atheist or atheistic comes in the form of accusations levelled against individuals and or their ideas or beliefs and in some cases rebuttals of these in which semantic clarity is often deliberately avoided

the third volume published in two parts is an account of every aspect of iranian civilisation from the death of alexander in 323 bc to the advent of islam in the seventh century ad this complex period of major importance in iranian history and extending for almost a thousand years encompasses the reigns of the seleucid the parthian the kushan and sasanian dynasties as additions to the general objectives of these volumes professor yarshater has included in this volume chapters on the institutional administrative legal numismatic linguistic and literary aspects of the period and he further develops the scope of the volume by including studies of iran s interaction with neighbouring societies of iran s mythical and legendary history and of iranian settlements outside the geographical boundaries of iran and afghanistan this volume is the most comprehensive study published of this very important period of iran s history
