Adornos philosophical approach rejects the idea of progress as a linear teleological process Instead he emphasizes the contradictions and tensions inherent in society and the importance of constant questioning and critique

The Commodification of Experience

Adorno argued that capitalism increasingly turns all aspects of life into commodities undermining authentic human experience and replacing it with a shallow homogenized culture

Art as Resistance

Despite his pessimism Adorno believed that art could serve as a powerful force for resistance against the dominant social order Art he argued has the potential to expose the contradictions
