12 Elements of a Crime To be convicted of a crime the prosecution must prove beyond a reasonable doubt that the accused

Actus Reus The guilty act the physical act or omission constituting the crime

Mens Rea The guilty mind the mental state of the accused at the time of the crime This can range from intentional to negligent depending on the offense

Example A person accused of assault must be proven to have intentionally struck the victim actus reus and acted with the intent to cause harm mens rea

13 Defenses in Criminal Law Defenses are legal arguments that aim to negate the prosecutions case preventing a conviction Common defenses include

Insanity A legal defense arguing the accused lacked the mental capacity to understand the wrongfulness of their actions

SelfDefense A defense claiming the accused acted in reasonable defense of themselves or another person

Entrapment A defense arguing the accused was induced by law enforcement to commit the crime

Example A defendant claiming selfdefense in a stabbing case would need to prove they reasonably believed they were in imminent danger and had no other option to escape

Murder Unlawful killing with malice aforethought

Manslaughter Unlawful killing without malice aforethought including voluntary heat of passion and involuntary negligent manslaughter
