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this book is for the clinician who wants to write it is for the physician physician assistant or nurse practitioner who sees patients and who wants to contribute to the medical literature you may be an assistant professor aspiring to promotion or a clinician in private practice who seeks the personal enrichment that writing can bring if you are new to medical writing or even if you have been the author of some articles or book chapters and seek to improve your abilities this book can help you who am i that i can make this assertion and write this book both fairly presumptuous here is my reasoning as a practicing physician writing has been my avocation unlike the authors of many other writing books i am not a journal editor over 14 years in private practice and 26 years in academic medicine i have written all the major models described in this book review articles case reports editorials letters to the editor book reviews book chapters edited books authored books and reports of clinical research studies most have been published not all perhaps my most significant qualification is not that i have managed to produce a lengthy curriculum vitae in my opinion what is more important for you the reader is that i have made all the errors that is right the mistakes
