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for anyone who has yet to discover mcewan s storytelling genius this is a dazzling introduction the time is 1955 in postwar berlin the combined forces of british and american technological intelligence is set to invade the soviet communications system the story follows a young british post office technician beginning his dizzying descent into the ever deeper echelons of electronic surveillance beneath the surface of berlin at the same time he meets a young german woman maria as his two worlds private and political claim him leonard senses his life is to be remarkably altered but he cannot foresee the horror that is to come readers familiar with ian mcewan will know to brace themselves for the unexpected yet it is impossible to anticipate the impact of this novel an espionage thriller with a subtle and haunting execution the innocent is a brilliant read and possesses perhaps one of the most powerful and satisfying conclusions capturing the spirit of the end of the cold war

a member of a british american surveillance team in cold war berlin finds himself in too deep in this wholly entertaining work the wall street journal from the booker prize winner and bestselling author of atonement twenty five year old leonard marnham s intelligence work tunneling under a russian communications

center to tap the phone lines to moscow offers him a welcome opportunity to begin shedding his own unwanted innocence even if he is only a bit player in a grim international comedy of errors his relationship with maria eckdorf an enigmatic and beautiful west berliner likewise promises to loosen the bonds of his ordinary life but the promise turns to horror in the course of one terrible evening a night when marnham learns just how much of his innocence he s willing to shed don t miss ian mcewan s new novel lessons

into a berlin wrenched between east and west comes twenty five year old leonard marnham assigned to a british american surveillance team though only a pawn in an international plot leonard uses his secret work to escape the bonds of his ordinary life the promise of his new life begins to be fulfilled as leonard becomes a crucial part of the surveillance team while simultaneously being initiated into a new world of love and sex by maria a beautiful young german woman it is a promise that turns to horror in the course of one terrible evening a night when leonard marnham learns just how much of his innocence he s willing to shed the plot crackles like thin ice with dread and suspense sunday times

in imagining history one must inevitably rely on its textual representations whether fictitious or supposedly objective yet always subject to the constraints and conventions of textuality still it is precisely by exploiting and consciously relying on the textual in the presentation of the past that contemporary authors including politicians and makers of history strive to provide it with current significance emotional impact and universal meaning the study of such attempts benefits from a variety of perspectives encompassing not only classical but also popular texts and media an interdisciplinary collection of papers devoted to the issues of retelling rewriting and representation of the past in fiction and various text types this volume juxtaposes modern and post modern understanding of collective versus personal history the contributors are scholars specializing in literary studies e g postcolonialism and popular fiction linguistics e g critical discourse analysis and cultural studies e g media studies bringing a wide spectrum of theoretical insights into the field the collection opens with papers on the general changes in viewing history that have occurred since the 19th century further papers discuss postcolonial feminist and gender related perspectives on history reflected in postmodern fiction revealing the power struggle around the depiction of the past the next part of the volume is devoted to the presentation of historical breakthroughs in political and media discourse finally the collection draws attention to some unorthodox visions of history involving alternative worlds and fantastic elements encountered in the genre of speculative fiction

winner of the 1987 whitbread novel of the year award when first published with extraordinary tenderness and insight mcewan takes us into the dark territory of a marriage that is devastated by a child gone missing
