the architecture and architectural culture of the netherlands have been causing quite a stir in recent years a great many remarkable new buildings and projects testify to the current flowering in dutch architecture urban planning and landscaping that s so exciting to so many in and out of the field artificial landscape illustrates the results of this late twentieth century surge of creativity and traces the background of its success examining both the dutch phenomenon and its socio historical context to find out what makes it work so well what we find is that even in a period of globalization there is still such a thing as a dutch climate yet despite this culture s specific national character we have much to learn from it particularly where its unique synthesis of architecture urbanism and landscaping is concerned this exciting movement is represented by a selection of designs built works ideas plans and manifestoes from such architects and firms as oma rem koolhaas neutelings riedijk mvrdv maunce nio and max 1 to name only a few apart from recording the state of things in dutch architecture artificial landscape also serves as a survey of contemporary architectural criticism collecting the most important critiques of dutch architecture urban planning and landscape architecture to have appeared in recent years

the la forum reader brings together three decades of discursive writings and publications on architecture urbanism and los angeles culled from the archives of the los angeles forum for architecture and urban design published under thematic sections experiments detours hunches and santa anas with interludes dedicated to art and architecture downtown and the long running la forum newsletter the collected essays and interviews track an uneven and lesser known history of experimental architecture postmodern geographies and alternative urbanism in l a as told by the city s key designers and thinkers today los angeles is a major architectural and urban player but for decades the city was dismissed suburban and centerless in republishing three decades of material on architecture and design in los angeles the la forum reader reclaims and reconsiders the city s architectural and discursive histories it establishes or reestablishes a textual context for critical experimentation and urban investigation this anthological volume includes essays interviews and reproductions of publications that have long been out of print including pamphlets by craig hodgetts and margaret crawford as well as early writings by aaron betsky and john chase

this book brings together a series of new and historical case studies to show how different phases of globalization are transforming the built environment taking a broad interdisciplinary approach the author draws on sociological geographical cultural and postcolonial studies to provide a critical account of the development of three key concepts global culture post colonialism and modernity subsequent case studies examine how global economic political and cultural forces shape the forms of architectural and urban modernity in globalized suburbs and spaces in major cities worldwide the first book to combine global and postcolonial theoretical approaches to the built environment and to illustrate these with examples spaces of global cultures argues for a more historical and interdisciplinary understanding of globalization one that places material space and the built environment at the centre and calls for new theories to address new conditions

the volume addresses the hybridisation of knowledge production in space related research in contrast with interdisciplinary knowledge which is primarily located in scholarly environments transdisciplinary knowledge production entails a fusion of academic and non academic knowledge theory and practice discipline and profession architecture and urbanism operating as both a discipline and a profession seems to form a particularly receptive ground for transdisciplinary research however this specificity has not yet been developed into a full fledged unique mode of knowledge production in order to dedicate specific attention to transdisciplinary knowledge production this book aims to explore new hybrid modes of inquiry that allow many of architecture s longstanding schisms to be overcome such as between theory history and practice critical theory and projective design the adoption of an external viewpoint and a view from within often under the guise of bottom up vs top down it therefore offers the reader a mix of contributions that elaborate on knowledge production that is situated in the architectural and urban profession or practice and on practice based approaches in theory

this book provides a simple but comprehensive framework for the emerging academic discipline of urban design from its origins in europe and america to contemporary issues of imagery finance and marketing in an age of globalisation there is currently no contemporary textbook for urban design that includes a general history and theory of the subject internationally urban design is more and more becoming a core subject taught in architecture schools the aia us and the riba uk both require undergraduates and graduates to study the urban dimension of architectural design on a wider scale in europe the eu is developing a common architectural curriculum which includes an urban component for under graduates the situation is similar in schools across asia and australia aimed at both students and teachers this book provides a simple and accessible framework from the origins of urban

vast interior spaces have become ubiquitous in the contemporary city the soaring atriums and concourses of mega hotels shopping malls and transport interchanges define an increasingly normal experience of being inside in a city yet such spaces are also subject to intense criticism and claims that they can destroy the quality of a city s authentic life on the outside interior urbanism explores the roots of this contemporary tension between inside and outside identifying and analysing the concept of interior urbanism and tracing its history back to the works of john portman and associates in 1960s and 70s america portman increasingly recognised as an influential yet understudied figure was responsible for projects such as peachtree center in atlanta and the los angeles bonaventure hotel developments that employed vast internal atriums to define a world of possibilities not just for hotels and commercial spaces but for the future of the american downtown amid the upheavals of the 1960s and 70s the book analyses portman s architecture in order to reconsider major contexts of debate in architecture and urbanism in this period including the massive expansion of a commercial imperative in architecture shifts in the governance and development of cities amid social and economic instability the rise of postmodernism and critical urban studies and the defence of the street and public space amid the continual upheavals of urban development in this way the book reconsiders the american city at a crucial time in its development identifying lessons for how we consider the forces at work and the spaces produced in cities in the present

fresh arguments for traditional architecture and urbanism bess dissects the questionable intellectual assumptions of contemporary architecture how modern societies find physical expression in contemporary suburban sprawl by considering the role of both the natural law tradition and communal religion in providing intellectual and spiritual depth to contemporary attempts to build new and revive existing traditional towns and cities

the states of northern mexico tamaulipas nuevo león coahuila chihuahua durango sonora sinaloa and baja california norte and sur have architecture urbanism and landscape design that offer numerous lessons in how to build well but this constructed environment is largely undervalued or unknown to make this architecture better known to a wide professional academic and public audience this book presents the first comprehensive overview in either english or spanish of the architecture urban landscapes and cities of northern mexico from the country s emergence as a modern nation in 1821 to the present day profusely illustrated with color and black and white photographs maps and analytical drawings of urban cores of major cities the architecture and cities of northern mexico systematically examines significant works of architecture in large cities and small towns in each state from the earliest buildings in the urban core to the newest at the periphery edward r burian describes the most

memorable works of architecture in each city in greater detail in terms of their spatial organization materials and sensory experience he also includes a concise geographical and historical summary of the region that provides a useful background for the discussions of the works of architecture burian concludes the book with a brief commentary on lessons learned and possible futures for the architectural culture of the region as well as the first comprehensive biographical listing of the architects practicing in northern mexico during the past two centuries

a definitive intellectual history of landscape urbanism it has become conventional to think of urbanism and landscape as opposing one another or to think of landscape as merely providing temporary relief from urban life as shaped by buildings and infrastructure but driven in part by environmental concerns landscape has recently emerged as a model and medium for the city with some theorists arguing that landscape architects are the urbanists of our age in landscape as urbanism one of the field s pioneers presents a powerful case for rethinking the city through landscape charles waldheim traces the roots of landscape as a form of urbanism from its origins in the renaissance through the twentieth century growing out of progressive architectural culture and populist environmentalism the concept was further informed by the nineteenth century invention of landscape architecture as a new art charged with reconciling the design of the industrial city with its ecological and social conditions in the late twentieth and early twenty first centuries as urban planning shifted from design to social science and as urban design committed to neotraditional models of town planning landscape urbanism emerged to fill a void at the heart of the contemporary urban project generously illustrated landscape as urbanism examines works from around the

world by designers ranging from ludwig hilberseimer andrea branzi and frank lloyd wright to james corner adriaan geuze and michael van valkenburgh the result is the definitive account of an emerging field that is likely to influence the design of cities for decades to come

helmut holzapfel s urbanism and transport a bestseller in its own country now available in english examines the history and the future of urban design for transport in major european cities urbanism and transport shows how the automobile has come to dominate the urban landscape of cities throughout the world providing thought provoking analysis of the societal and ideological precursors that have given rise to these developments it describes the transformation that occurred in urban life through the ongoing separation of social functions that began in the 1920s and has continued to produce today s phenomenon of fractured urban experience a sort of island urbanism professor holzapfel examines the vital relation between the house and the street in the urban environment and explains the importance of small scale mixed use urban development for humane city living contrasting such developments with the overpowering role that the automobile typically plays in today s cities taking the insights gained from its historical analysis with a special focus on germany and the rise of fascism the book provides recommendations for architects and engineers on how urban spaces streets structures and transport networks can be more successfully integrated in the present day urbanism and transport is a key resource for architects transport engineers urban and spatial planners and students providing essential basic knowledge about the urban situation and the challenges of reclaiming cities to serve the basic needs of people rather than the imperatives of automobile transport

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
