the international baccalaureate ib works with schools governments and international organizations to develop challenging programmes of international education and rigorous assessment this three phase study prepared by the educational policy improvement center epic on behalf of the international baccalaureate organization explored the impact of the international baccalaureate ib diploma programme on college readiness by examining the academic and non academic preparation of students who participated in ib diploma programmes in high school the first phase of this study involved analyses of academic indicators of college success using extant data for ib honors and non ib honors students between 2005 and 2012 in the second phase ib honors and non ib honors students took a postsecondary version of campusready a self report instrument that gauges metacognitive cognitive and college adjustment behaviors and attitudes mapped to the four keys to college and career readiness 1 key cognitive strategies 2 key content knowledge 3 key learning skills and techniques and 4 key transition knowledge and skills epic employed a qualitative methodology in the final phase to more closely examine how ib honors students differed in preparation and college experience from non ib honors students the following are appended 1 t chart of ib diploma programme components and 2 attribute sort responses

this dissertation investigated the effects of leadership on student achievement in international baccalaureate ib diploma programme dp and non ib dp schools in the united states for this

quantitative study data were collected from teachers in four types of public state comprehensive high schools higher performing hp ib dp lower performing lp ib dp hp non ib dp and lp non ib dp schools with a lower percentage of students who attained the ib diploma and or a lower average act composite score were designated lower performing while schools with a higher percentage of students attaining the ib diploma and or a higher average act composite score were designated higher performing teachers n 53 examined the leadership characteristics of their principals through an inventory survey entitled breaking ranks ii 21st century school administrator skills developed by the national association of secondary school principals containing 67 questions that examined leadership through the following constructs setting instructional direction teamwork sensitivity judgment results orientation organizational ability oral communication written communication development of others and understanding one s own strengths and weaknesses after completing a factor analysis judgment split into two constructs judgment and decision making data were analyzed through t tests that compared hp lp ib and non ib hp ib hp non ib and lp ib lp non ib school groups an analysis of variance anova was used to compare hp ib hp non ib lp ib and lp non ib school groups the data revealed a significant difference between hp and lp school groups there were no significant differences between ib and non ib school groups and there were no significant differences in leadership perceptions between hp non ib dp schools and hp ib dp schools however in a larger sample group the differences between these means were large enough that they would have reached significance t test results indicated significant differences in leadership between lp non ib and lp ib school groups finally the anova presented differences in leadership between lp hp ib and non ib school groups these results suggested that leadership makes more of a difference between hp and lp student achievement in an international baccalaureate diploma program context

the results of this investigation suggest that the constructivist epistemology and student centred process focused pedagogical approach espoused by the ib are well aligned with what empirical evidence suggests is srl promoting practice although the ib diploma programme is widely considered an appropriate secondary programme for high achieving students the dp s potential to enhance srl suggests this programme may also be an appropriate option for some university bound students with learning difficulties as the literature review for this investigation uncovered only one previous study pertaining to ib diploma programme students with learning difficulties this is a significant contribution to knowledge with implications for admissions as well as teaching and learning in ib schools this investigation also indicates that epistemic awareness may play a more significant role in srl than contemporary theories suggest and further that adopting a criteria driven mastery by performance goal orientation may be more beneficial to srl in some contexts than a mastery orientation motivated by intrinsic interest in learning these contributions represent new directions for researchers who wish to investigate srl in real educational settings

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
