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this provocative book the first in english on japanese avant garde art after 1945 is the catalogue of the most ambitious exhibition of its kind it surveys some 200 works from painting and sculpture to performance and video by more than 100 artists the exhibition comes to the guggenheim museum new york in september over 445 illustrations 200 in full color

over two decades ago we were confronted by the end of the soviet union and collapse of the geo political divisions that had defined much of the twentieth century from this particular end the end of history was proclaimed but is it still possible to argue that liberal democracy and free market capitalism are the final form of law and mode of production in human history recent events have called this into question the arab spring the war on terror global economic crises and looming ecological crises it seems that history is far from over yet the idea of the end remains for example in the question of the future of the american empire the establishment of a new era of international law and the resurgence of religion as a dominant source of political identification this collection of essays explores the end in various contexts including art politics and the philosophy of time and existence in different ways all of the essays address emerging horizons of meaning and reality

this study of the films of oshima nagisa is both an essential introduction to the work of a major postwar director of japanese cinema and a theoretical exploration of strategies of filmic style for almost forty years oshima has produced provocative films that have received wide distribution and international acclaim formally innovative as well as socially daring they provide a running commentary direct and indirect on the

cultural and political tensions of postwar japan best known today for his controversial films in the realm of the senses and the empire of passion oshima engages issues of sexuality and power domination and identity which maureen turim explores in relation to psychoanalytic and postmodern theory the films complex representation of women in japanese society receives detailed and careful scrutiny as does their political engagement with the japanese student movement postwar anti american sentiments and critiques of stalinist tendencies of the left turim also considers oshima s surprising comedies his experimentation with brechtian and avant garde theatricality as well as reflexive textuality and his essayist documentaries in this look at an artist s gifted and vital attempt to put his will on film this title is part of uc press s voices revived program which commemorates university of california press s mission to seek out and cultivate the brightest minds and give them voice reach and impact drawing on a backlist dating to 1893 voices revived makes high quality peer reviewed scholarship accessible once again using print on demand technology this title was originally published in 1999 this study of the films of oshima nagisa is both an essential introduction to the work of a major postwar director of japanese cinema and a theoretical exploration of strategies of filmic style for almost forty years oshima has produced provocative film

introduction to two decades of artistic ferment in postwar japan as that devastated nation confronted the fraught legacy of world war ii a rapid succession of avant garde groups began experimenting with new media and processes of making art disrupting conventions to address the changes occurring around them the works that remain from this era are largely ephemeral exhibition flyers programs for performances musical scores issues of short lived journals documentary photographs pieces of mail art and multiples made from the detritus of modern life but the ideals of engagement and innovation that invigorated this creative surge are not

this book documents an exhibition entitled where heaven meets earth comprising works by artists xu bing and cai guo qiang bing is known for his bold calligraphic teasing thought provoking pieces that challenge preconceptions about written communication while guo qiang s approach draws on a wide variety of symbols narratives traditions and materials such as feng shui chinese medicine dragons roller coasters computers vending machines and gunpowder curated by zhang zhaohui the exhibition was staged in the art museum of the center for curatorial studies at bard college also included here are recent pieces by the two

artists and an essay on their careers a critical look at the works of two of the most internationally important and prominent artists from china
