darwinian evolution is an imaginative problem that has been passed down to us unsolved it is our most powerful explanation of humanity s place in nature but it is also more cognitively demanding and less emotionally satisfying than any myth from the publication of the origin of species in 1859 evolution has pushed our capacity for storytelling into overdrive sparking fairy tales adventure stories political allegories utopias dystopias social realist novels and existential meditations though this influence on literature has been widely studied it has not been explained psychologically this book argues for the adaptive function of storytelling integrates traditional humanist scholarship with current knowledge about the evolved and adapted human mind and calls for literary scholars to reframe their interpretation of the first authors who responded to darwin

the history of philosophy has been studied as if it were a long discussion between participants of differing opinions living in different ages but all in the same world though heraclitus and descartes can no longer respond to new questions or current attacks on

their positions nevertheless to the degree that we are all human and all live in the same world such questions and attacks are reasonably fair until recently in the last 50 years the significance of the qualifier to the degree that has changed radically what if it turns out that as far as living in the same world goes we today actually have very little in common with heraclitus or even descartes then we are attempting to carry on discussions with participants who are not our contemporaries and the world they were speculating about is not the same world we today are speculating about then the nature of the discussion the history of philosophy takes on a very different character philosophy and the evolution of consciousness takes talk of alternative conceptual schemes current in philosophy today and applies it in the very place most likely to warrant the change the history of philosophy itself

this volume gathers together the work of david rosenthal on the philosophical study of consciousness from the past 20 years and represents his theory of consciousness as higher order thought an introduction draws out the connections between the essays and highlights their implications

this book focuses on hegel s philosophy of spirit his major concept and the core of his mature system it does not so much define geist as it does illustrate its many forms and manifestations it is a broad ranging examination of volume iii of hegel s encyclopedia delineating his radical break with previous philosophy and illuminating the heart of his thought several themes recur the meaning and content of recognition and intersubjectivity religion hegel s predecessors and his contemporary successors or contrasts hegel s intentions and his audacity are made both clear and sharp in this work

jurgen moltmann and others contend that christian theology and the church face a dual crisis one of relevance and the other of identity despite making this pronouncement nearly forty years ago the church in the west continues to struggle with this crisis several proposals have been espoused from the way of wisdom to the way of ecclesial praxis yet little attention is given in protestant theological discourse to the role god s beauty plays in bringing theology and ethics together by neglecting god s beauty for theological

discourse we risk diminishing christian worship witness and wisdom god s beauty in act addresses these issues in part by arguing that the redemptive creative suffering and glorious resurrection of christ are the nexus of god s being beauty and christian living god s beauty understood as the fittingness of the incarnate son s actions in the spirit to the father s will radiates god s glory and draws perceivers into the dramatic movements of god s triune life these movements serve as the patterns that shape the imagination enabling participants to perform their parts creatively and fittingly in god s drama of redemption in doing so human beings flourish as they jettison false identities and realities of their own making that are incommensurate with god s purpose found in christ by the spirit
