most children have interesting interior lives that contain dreams fantasies hopes fears beliefs and their unconscious lives this can be inferred from their preoccupations stories plays games conversations and behaviour because many children with special needs are emotionally confused anxious and angry their

inner lives often contain secrets that may be permanent and damaging these children nevertheless put out clear signals that they want to be understood

there can be a lack of understanding of the vulnerable situation of children with disabilities and their families even among professional caregivers whose mission is to protect the health and wellbeing of these children their respectful treatment should include knowledge empathy humanity and an open and sympathetic dialogue this book provides an overview of knowledge and literature review of children and adolescents with special care needs that contribute to the respect and understanding of children with disabilities and their families it also explains possible reasons for different outcomes in research studies and why there is a lack of knowledge in some areas concerning these children research on children with disabilities is considerable but often can be difficult to access on many levels which means it does not always benefit those who need this knowledge this compact book addresses this by presenting the international research in the field in an understandable way for people who work with children with disabilities and their families the authors provide a broad picture of the background reality of life opportunities for professional help and support as well as outlook of these children and families among the topics covered the health and well being of children with disabilities the health and well being of relatives occupation on the road to adulthood children with special needs an overview of knowledge on disability is pertinent reading for students in all areas of health care including nursing and psychology social work sociology and education aimed at children and young people the text also would be of interest to those who practice in these areas and or encounter children with disabilities in their daily work

this book supplies stories essays lesson plans and specialized storytelling strategies to help teachers level the playing field for all learners and better serve children with special needs more than 57 percent of the over 6 million american children with disabilities are in inclusive i e general classrooms self contained classrooms serve children whose disabilities are either more severe or disruptive as much as 20 percent of the children in an inclusive classroom are identified as disabled with the highest percentage of these having learning disabilities while most classrooms have at least one child with a disability teachers often have little or no training in educating and caring for these children the need for resources that support educators working with children with disabilities or social emotional

this book chronicles the author s journey as a social justice advocate for children who have been identified for special education services in her role as a school psychologist the author has helped many families and educational stakeholders over the years better understand the relationship between a student s disability and its implication s in the classroom at home as well as within their local community however it was not until the author became the parent of two children with disabilities that she finally understood the raw emotions and concerns faced by many families of children with special needs and developmental challenges the author provides a snapshot into her lived experiences as she comes to terms with parenting children with special needs while balancing her career as a school psychologist the author provides the reader with suggestions on finding ways to balance parenting and or working with children with special needs

children with disabilities have special needs but perhaps their greatest need is to be understood and accepted by other children it includes background information and simulation exercises about communicative developmental physical and learning disabilities a comprehensive resource for parents and teachers of children with special needs

for integration of special needs students to succeed teachers and caregivers must be aware of the challenges inclusion can present and engage in thoughtful planning and follow through this book provides information and support for early childhood staff with special needs children in their classrooms the introduction describes the child with special needs and why this child is in a regular class the second chapter addresses dealing with teacher s feelings about persons with special needs while the third chapter suggests areas in need of consideration when preparing oneself and the physical environment to accommodate such children the child with special needs and ways to assist with integration are discussed in chapter 4 while techniques that the staff can use to encourage acceptance and understanding of children with special needs by children with typical needs are suggested in chapter 5 chapters 6 and 7 outline respectively working with parents of both groups of children and working with other service agencies names of organizations suppliers of relevant publications and materials and publications children s books recordings and videos are listed in the resource section of the book
